What is NEXus?

NEXus - The Nursing Xchange is where institutions collaborate from around the country to achieve a cost effective way to expand doctoral-level academic opportunities for their students and grow online class enrollment.

How it Works

Students from member institutions choose from a catalog of over 350 online graduate course offerings from 17 universities. PhD, DNP and select Masters-level students take full advantage of their existing financial aid packages, pay the common tuition price, and earn credits towards their own university’s program.

Bo Perry Welcomed as New Project Director and Executive Director, WIN

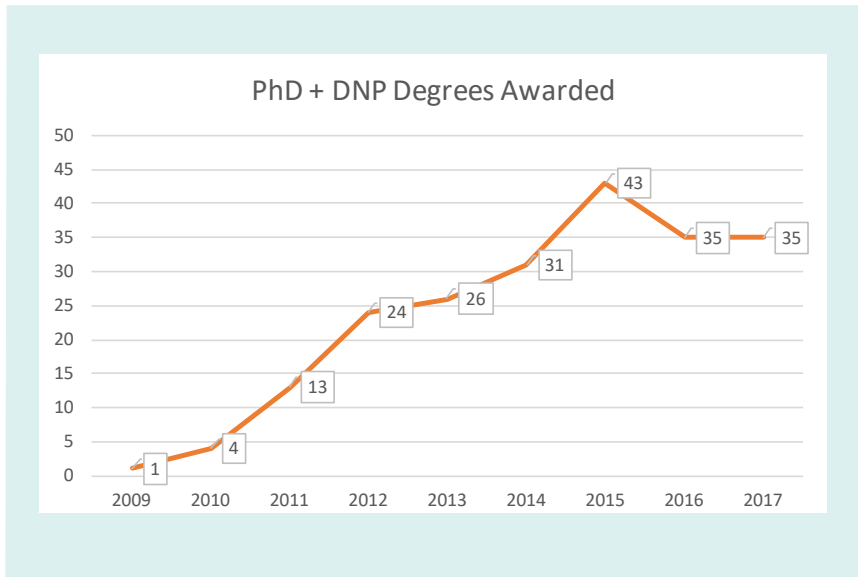

NEXus began in 2004, registered its first class in 2006, and has grown to enroll more than 850 students from 17 universities, with course offerings exceeding 300. Students from NEXus member institutions are completing their respective degrees and graduating, contributing 212 well-prepared doctoral level nurses to date.



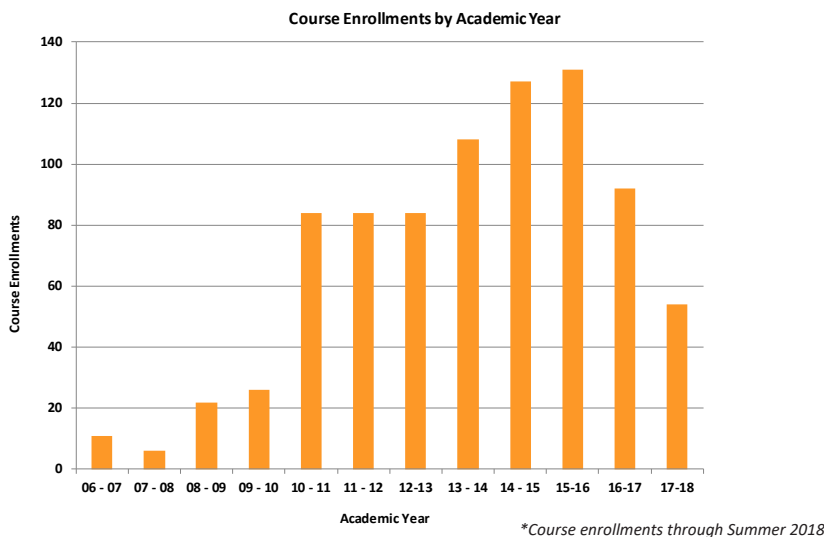

NEXus Enrollments

Registrations have grown to over 825 since the program began in 2006. As many as 120 students are registered in a given academic year.

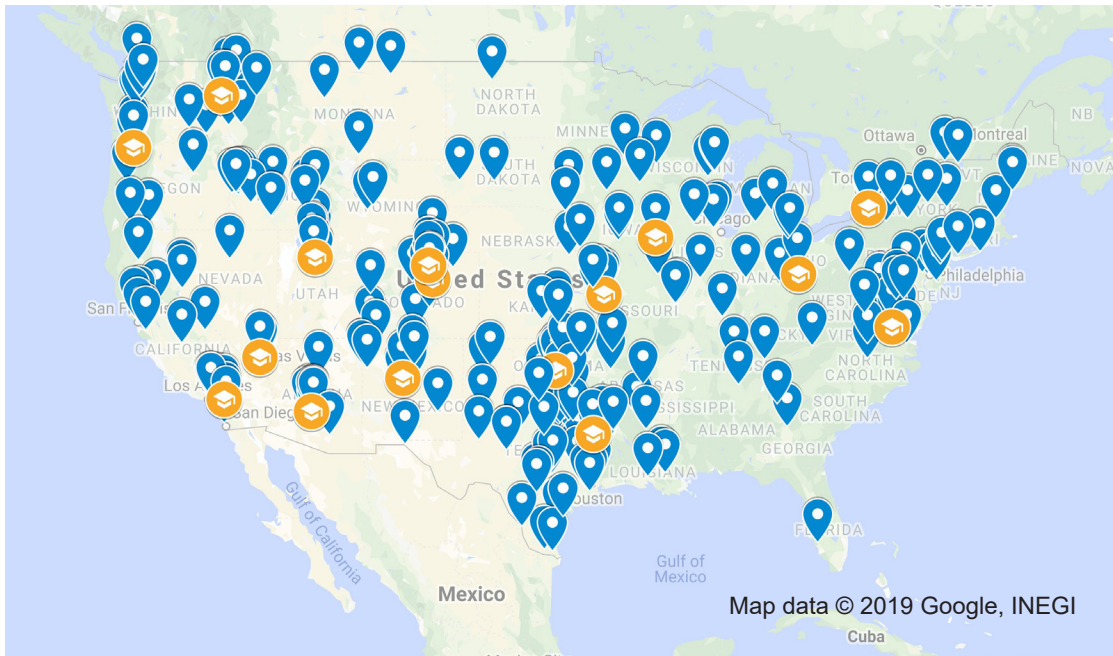

Mapping Where Students Come From

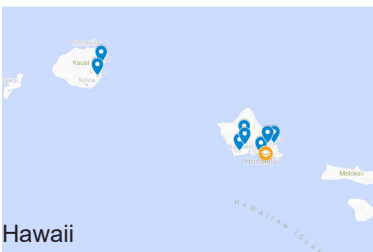

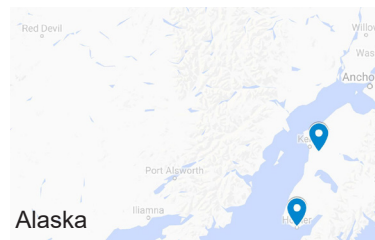
