What Is NEXus?

NEXus, The Nursing Education Xchange, is a non-profit course sharing consortium where universities offer their online graduate nursing courses. Over 250 MSN, DNP and PhD classes are scheduled each year.

Why Join NEXus?

Universities can address the demand for curriculum flexibility while faculty vacancies are high. Schools of Nursing can:

- Meet enrollment minimums
- Gain tuition income
- Maintain curriculum rigor

How It Works

Institutions pay annual dues and students pay a common tuition rate. Tuition is shared among the home and teaching institutions and the NEXus office, with teaching institutions retaining 75%. Students from member institutions choose from the catalog of online graduate courses. Students may take advantage of their existing financial aid and earn credits toward their own university's program.
